Lisa M. Freeman, DVM, PhD, DACVN

Professor, Clinical Sciences, Tufts Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine

Dr. Freeman grew up in Florida but has completed most of her training in the Northeast. She received her BS from Tufts University, her DVM from Tufts Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine, and a PhD in Nutrition from Tufts School of Nutrition. She completed a rotating small animal internship at North Carolina State University before doing a residency in Clinical Nutrition at Tufts. She is board-certified by the American College of Veterinary Nutrition and has been on faculty at Tufts Cummings School of Veterinary Medicine since 1996, where she is currently a Professor in the Department of Clinical Sciences. Her research focus is nutritional modulation of cardiac disease and critical care nutrition.
