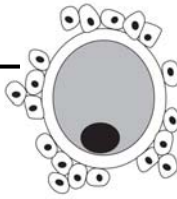
Registration Information

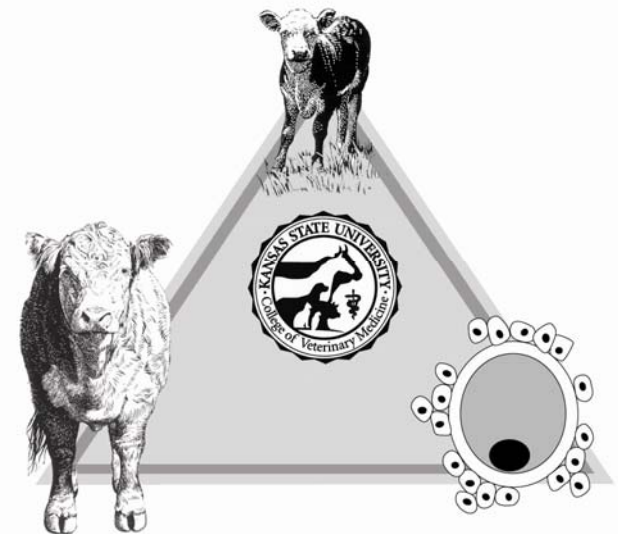
