

# Learn more about the multilateral trading system, food safety, and animal, plant, and human health!

Dr. Justin Kastner and the *Frontier* program invite students to enroll in **DMP 816 Trade and Agricultural Health** (reference number is 15532), a 2-hour distance course intended for graduate and undergraduate students keen to enhance their understanding of the multilateral trading system and its relevance to the international agricultural food trade. The course will be most useful to those undertaking studies in the food safety and security, epidemiology, public health, agriculture, food science, political science, agricultural economics, veterinary medicine, and international relations. Dr. Kastner teaches this course in partnership with Dr. Maria Correa, North Carolina State University.

## Enroll & learn about:

- World Trade Organization (WTO)
- WTO Agreement on the Application of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (the SPS Agreement)
- The “Three Sisters” (the Codex Alimentarius Commission, the World Organization for Animal Health, and the International Plant Protection Convention)

The course will also address such important topics as technical barriers to trade, subsidies, trade-related aspects of intellectual property rights, anti-dumping measures, food safety, and public health.
