

Veterinary Research Scholars Safety Information Packet

Each Veterinary Research Scholar must complete the following before they begin working in a research laboratory:

1. Safety Compliance Form

Each student must complete and sign the College of Veterinary Medicine Safety Compliance Form and obtain the signature of their supervisor. This form must be kept in the laboratory in which they are working.

2. Radioactive Materials

Because Veterinary Scholars usually work in research laboratories for a limited time, these students are discouraged from using radioactive isotopes. In the event their use is necessary to complete their project, the following must be observed:

- a) Notification must be given to the Radiation Safety Officer:

Dr. Bridges will provide the student with a Radiation Safety Manual, a personnel monitoring device (i.e., film badge) and information about the training required for the isotope in question. ****Work with radioisotopes cannot begin until the student has spoken with Dr. Bridges****

- b) Training particular to the laboratory in which the student is working.

3. Working with Laboratory and/or Farm Animals

Veterinary Scholars are prohibited from working with any animals until the PI has added the student to the appropriate IACUC forms and the student has completed the appropriate IACUC training and these forms have been submitted.
