LIBRARIES EMBRACE OPEN EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES AND OPEN SCIENCE INITIATIVES

Libraries and academics have long been familiar with Open Educational Resources (OER) initiatives. However, the push for expanding these concepts through the Open Science movement is gaining momentum. Open Science emphasizes transparency, sharing, and inclusivity, aiming to democratize access to research and promote equitable resource distribution. The movement also seeks to foster accountability, accelerate self-correction, and improve rigor and reproducibility in scientific research.

Open Science and OER both strive to ensure that data, protocols, papers, and research findings are easily accessible, often for free, breaking down the barriers of paywalls. Additionally, Open Science advocates for open evaluation and peer review processes, enhancing engagement, accountability, and trust in the scientific process.

Despite accessibility limitations faced by academic institutions, the Veterinary Medicine Library (VML) is committed to exploring ways to make OER and Open Science resources more readily available to patrons. The library currently offers access to the Open/Alternative Textbook Initiative, the K-State Open Access Publishing Fund, and other Open Access agreements through K-State, Hale Library, and its own services.
