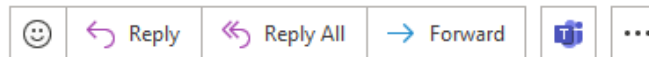

**Course Description and Goals:** This course is intended for veterinary students that are less familiar with horses and the equine industry. The goal of this course is to enhance students' equine specific knowledge and understanding as they plan to work with equine patients and horse owners.

**Course Objectives:**

The course is broken into 4 main areas:

- 1) Introduction into horses and equine veterinary medicine

2) Equine Gaits, Locomotion and Performance

3) Health and Preventable Disease

4) Issues that Impact the Profession

Introduction into horses and equine veterinary medicine

- Basic communication with horse owners and various equine caregivers
- Common lay horse terminology
- Identification of common equine breeds
- Understand what horse owners do with their horses and how that relates to breed of horse.
- What genetic diseases are associated with these common breeds.
- Understanding of equine behavior and general management practices for horses

Equine locomotion and performance

- Students will be expected to recognize a walk, trot, canter and gallop
- Know the breeds of horses that are "gaited" and which are not.
- Definition of lameness (and degree of lameness by AAEP grading).
- Basic understanding of how to perform a lameness examination
- Understand what things a farrier does versus a veterinarian.
- Basic equipment for removing a shoe

Health and preventative medicine

- Veterinary practice acts and equine dentistry
- Equine dental examination and details of service
- Core and risk based equine vaccination
- Preventative health assessment, federal requirements for EIA testing
- Use of equine health certificates

Issues facing the equine veterinary profession

- What are some equine welfare issues that involve equine veterinarians
- Why are there drug medication rules at horse shows?
- Understanding of what therapeutic medications rules are.

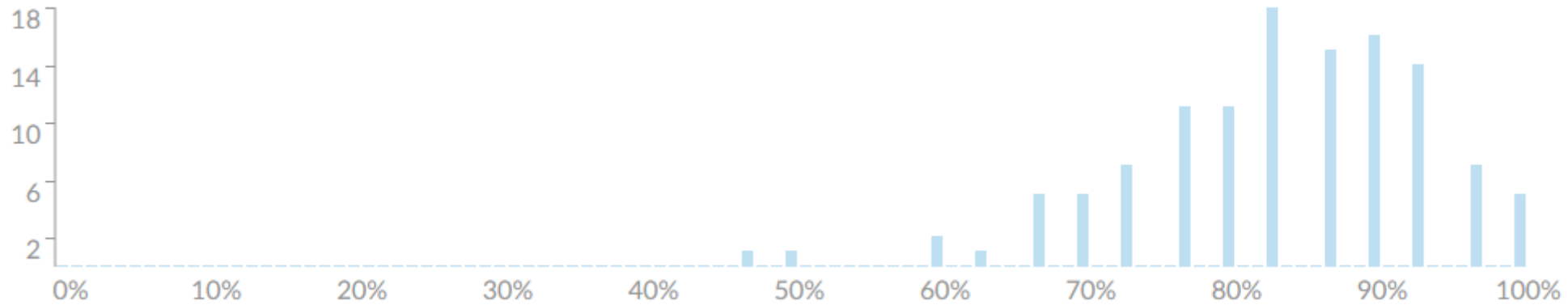
