

The Shelter Medicine Veterinary Certificate (SMVC) program is offered for current Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) students. The goal of the SMVC is to prepare DVM students for long-term success in the field of shelter medicine by incorporating skills that include shelter animal care, shelter animal behavior and well-being, high-quality high-volume sterilization surgery and shelter management consultation. Attaining this certificate will provide DVM graduates with a well-rounded foundation for a career in Shelter Medicine. It will also afford veterinary students with the distinguished knowledge and skills to positively impact the medical and behavioral health of sheltered animals in the communities around them.

Benefits

- 1) SMVC students will have a well-defined pathway to successful training through the completion of complementary coursework and experiential learning to develop a wide array of skills and aptitudes for veterinary practice in a shelter setting, which will enhance their confidence and prepare them for future success in the field.
- 2) Completion of the certificate program will provide a concise and transparent mechanism for new graduates to communicate their training and skills to prospective employers and allow employers to identify students with skills needed for best practice success. SMVC students will have an advantage when communicating with future employers as completion of the program illustrates interest, commitment to the process and a specific level of education.

To complete the certificate program, students must:

- 1. Students must complete the required number of required core and elective courses with a minimum grade of "C" in each course.
- Students must complete the Fear Free Shelter Certificate® (Online) during their time at K-State. Either as a part of VCS 891K or by themselves throughout the 3 first years.
