Manhattan is a rapidly expanding vibrant college town with a good quality of life. It hosts a range of restaurants and bars catering to international and national tastes. Lively night life can be found in the Aggieville area whilst those seeking high end restaurants and quieter bars can head to the Downtown area. Manhattan provides a safe and healthy environment for students to enjoy their studies and social life.



The surrounding countryside offers almost limitless outdoor activities. Horseback riding, hiking, cycling, kayaking, paddle boarding, and fishing are on the doorstep, whilst a weekend skiing, climbing or white water rafting in Colorado is only a day's drive by car. If you prefer shopping, museums and the big city activities, Kansas City is only a two hour drive. McCain auditorium and the Wareham Opera House provide regular shows, plays and concerts in Manhattan.

Manhattan is not flat as most people think. Manhattan is located in the Flint Hills, which offer stunning scenery and the last natural tallgrass prairie in North America. The prairie is home to a multitude of wildlife including bison, deer, coyote, and rich bird life (including the bald eagle).

Manhattan airport is well connected internationally without the fuss and stress of larger airports. It is connected by 5 direct flights per day to two international airport hubs (2 to Chicago and 3 to Dallas). Kansas City International airport is also accessible in a short drive.

Opportunities

Kansas State College of Veterinary Medicine (CVM) offers a **host of opportunities** for both **American and International students** to gain a truly **global perspective** in veterinary medicine whilst studying for a **DVM**, a postgraduate qualification (**Masters, PhD or Certificate**) and/or engaging in research or training.



Infectious Disease, Epidemiology, Genomics and Diagnostics

CVM creates and provides opportunities for **collaborative research, engaging partners across the world**. With a growing international team of world leading scientists in infectious diseases, epidemiology, genomics, vaccines and diagnostics coupled with state of the art high containment facilities, CVM is the **first choice** for developing a research career in **animal infectious diseases and zoonoses**.

In 2022 the U.S. Government's **flagship high containment animal disease** facility (National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility (NBAF)) will be operational in Manhattan, Kansas. NBAF will be next door to the CVM and is the only laboratory in the country to work with the highest containment pathogens. This will provide unique opportunities for careers and research.

Growing International Programs

More than ever the **next generation of veterinarians need to be equipped with a global perspective** and CVM is actively pursuing this through its Program in International Veterinary Medicine:

- Ten board-certified pathologists with the technology to remotely consult with clients, students, and colleagues across the world.
- OIE veterinary education establishment twinning project with Sokoine University of Agriculture in Tanzania.
- Ten Centers of Excellence
- Strong links with industry through the Beef Cattle Institute which tackles key issues such as food safety, welfare and the environment through outreach, education and research.

- Expanding **international research** collaboration
- **Building partnerships and Twinning with veterinary colleges** outside of the USA
- Providing undergraduate and postgraduate students with a **global perspective**
- Developing solutions to **global health problems**
- **Preparing students for careers** in International Veterinary Medicine

CVM has a strong focus on **outcome orientated research** – translating research into practical solutions for disease detection and control in the USA and overseas.

CVM offers a **strong and robust clinical program in large and companion animal medicine and surgery** with spacious and well-equipped hospital facilities. The strong link between CVM and the Agriculture College ensures that production and food security are well integrated into the program. The CVM also has a clinical exotic animal medicine and surgery team.
