Veterinary Biomedical Sciences MS; Area of Emphasis.

- **Clinical Sciences** offers a graduate program leading to the Master of Science (Veterinary Biomedical Science in Clinical Science) degree. Graduate work in clinical sciences is conducted in various areas of specialization in clinical sciences and research based on the faculty expertise. The department, along with the Veterinary Medical Teaching Hospital, has modern facilities and equipment for both basic and applied studies.

The primary goal of graduate study programs in clinical science is to prepare students for careers in teaching, research, or service in a clinical specialty area or research and development program. After completing graduate work, the student will be better prepared to conduct research both independently and as a team member. Adequate training in planning research projects and writing research proposals will give the student the ability to function with teams of scientists from the fields of biomedical and clinical sciences. The student's experience in teaching and literature study will form the basis for development of future teaching and research programs within his or her discipline.

The Clinical Sciences area of emphasis for the Veterinary Biomedical Science master's program can include graduate students, dual-degree students enrolled in the professional curriculum of the Veterinary College at Kansas State University, or concurrent residency-graduate programs. Introduction

The Graduate Handbook is published in hardcopy only occasionally. The electronic version is considered the official version of the Graduate Handbook since it is updated regularly after policies are adopted or modified by the Graduate Council. Therefore, the electronic version should be the reference for current policy.

Graduate students should become familiar with the policies and degree requirements in the Graduate Handbook. While flexibility is encouraged, regulations will not be waived or exceptions granted just because someone is unaware of specific policies or procedures.

This is particularly true if any policy or procedure appears to be at odds with achieving the primary objective of excellence in graduate education at Kansas State University.
