Ventilator with Integrated Air Mixer, \$50,000

The addition of a ventilator with an integrated air mixer and the ability to provide positive end-expiratory pressure, reverse ratio ventilation and humidification would serve the intensive care unit at the VHC. Currently, patients can be ventilated, but the ventilator needs updated.

Datex Cardiocap, Cardiopulmonary and Multiagent Monitors, \$20,000

These monitors are critically important to monitor blood pressure, ECG, respiratory parameters such as oxygen, carbon dioxide and anesthetic gases, respiratory volumes and flows. There are currently two monitors, one for each large and small animal, but due to case load, an additional is needed in small animal.

Integrated Capnographs and Pulse Oximeters, \$5,000 each

This equipment is used to monitor blood oxygenation and exhaled carbon dioxide in every anesthetized patients. Three units are needed to meet the needs of the VHC.

Heska Fluid Pumps, Syringe Pumps, Bair Hugger Patient Warmer \$2,000 each

This equipment is necessary to provide optimal patient care, safety and comfort.
